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THE OYSTER GOURMET

A SLIPPERY FIX

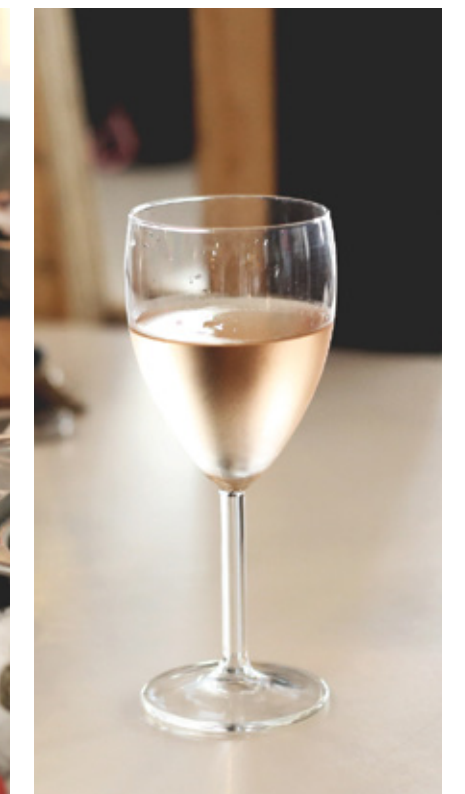
The Oyster Gourmet is a wooden, nautical-like shell that makes Robinson Crusoe relevant again. Christophe Happillon, is surrounded by eager eyes as he stands in the middle shucking oysters. With an oyster in one hand and a knife in another, he carefully wiggles and cracks open fresh, chilled oysters ready to be slurped back by craving patrons. He is the nucleus, the pearl, and the master écailler of The Oyster Gourmet. After years of successful pop-ups at Church and State, Le Zinque, and Perch, he finally set anchor as the newest purveyor at the Grand Central Market.

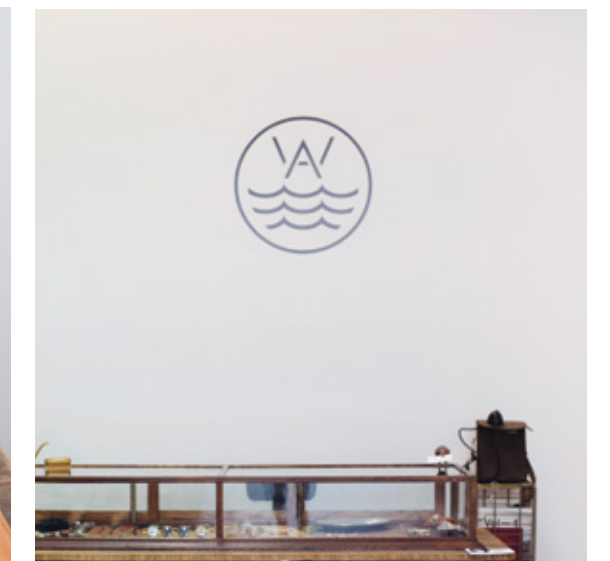
Shellfish lovers can get their slippery fix starting at \$9. Delivered twice a week from Vancouver to Washington, 3 oysters are served on a bed of ice with a slice of lemon, mignonette and a miniature fork to scoop out the delicate meat. In his distinctive French accent, Happillon presents each oyster to customers and recommends his technique on how to properly indulge. Slurp, chew lightly, and swallow. Drinking the residual juice is encouraged, there is no shame in expressing satisfaction as fellow customers' anticipation gains momentum sitting directly across to bear witness.

Stephan, the ceviche specialist, works by his side preparing mounds of fresh scallop, shrimp or tuna marinated in citrus and served on a half shell. The two work together in the small space, reflexively avoiding collision as they focus on their craft. They put on a comestible show and seafood is their medium.

Each experience at Alchemy Works renders a unique encounter with the merchandise at hand. While all retail stores rotate their inventory regularly, Alchemy Works tends to do so at a more unconventional pace. By consistently altering their stores products from designers like Stephen Kenn and Warby Parker, Alchemy Works shuffles around like a three dimensional design blog.

PART GALLERY, PART RETAIL SHOP, ALCHEMY WORKS INCORPORATES EACH ITEM WITH THOUGHTFUL CURATION.

Part gallery, part retail shop, Alchemy Works incorporates each item into the boutique with thoughtful curation. Here, products are not strewn, they are placed. Items like the Almond Longboard resting on top of the green 1971 Series III Defender Land Rover or the Vere Verto leather backpack on display find their place with the help of an experienced hand and a sharp eye.

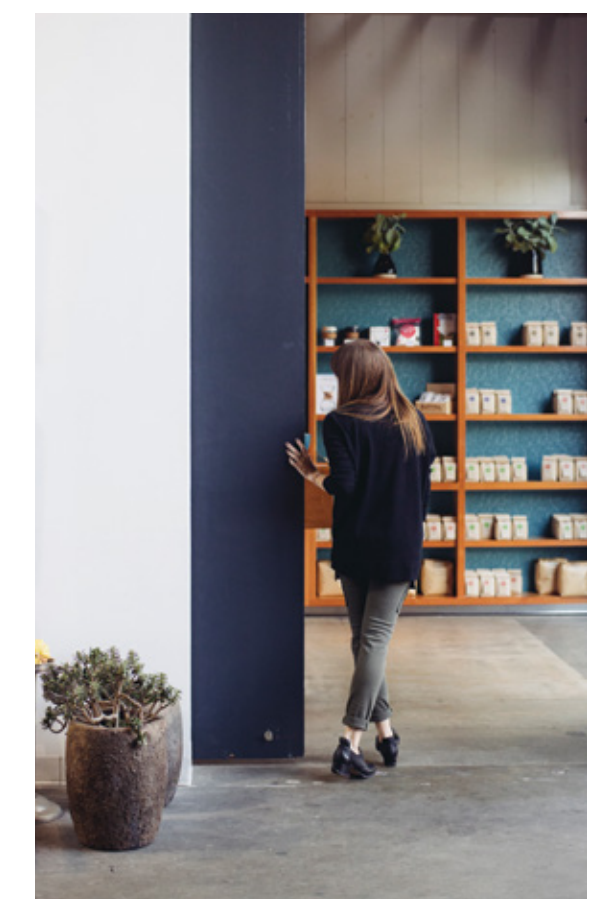
Owned by Raan Parton of Apolis and his wife Lindsay, Alchemy Works became a space

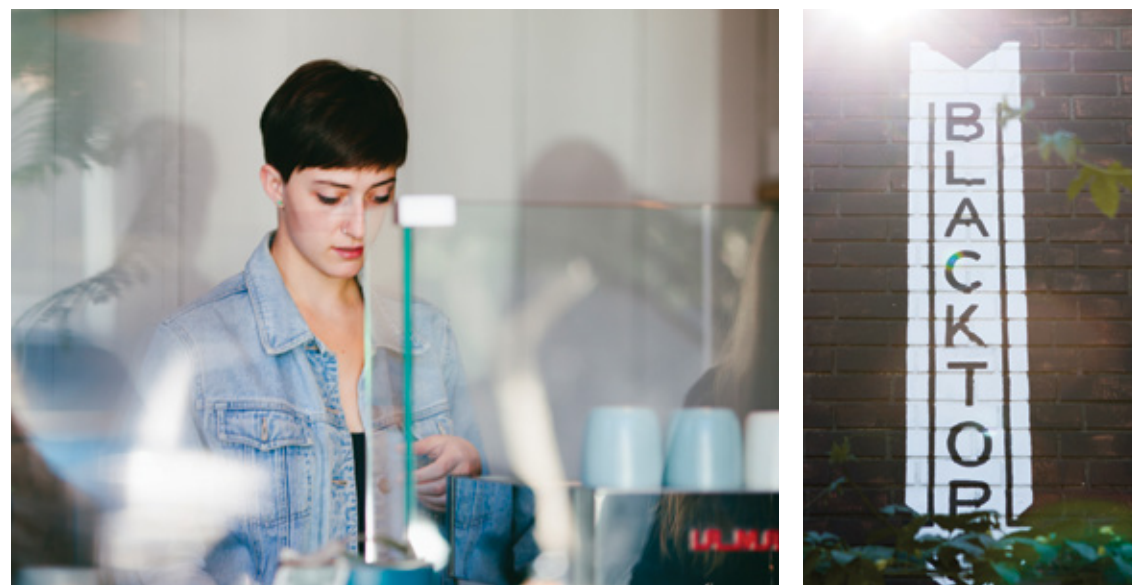
for artists to flourish in the world of retail with a California flair. Raan, raised in California, looks to Alchemy Works as an environment to glint like the golden coast. It only makes sense that the shop made its name in Downtown's Arts District.

One seasonal exception they will make for their exhibited retail is, of course, for the holidays. Custom wrap bracelets from Miansai, notebooks by Public Supply, and Driftwood Christmas trees by Madra Del Mar will deck their halls for the entire month of December. Armor Lux will also display exclusive shirts with custom stitching by Downtown neighbors Lot, Stock and Barrel. Each designer made their holiday items specifically for Alchemy Works and will not be found anywhere else.

Because of the pace of rotation and activity in the shop, the space breathes and has a mind free from the confinements of traditional retail expectations. Products do not come off the rack because of seasonal shipments, but rather, the pieces move when a customer makes a purchase. Alchemy Works bends to accommodate to LA's style rather than forces it to be what it's not.

BLACKTOP COFFEE

STRAIGHT UP, BLACK

Bah, humbug. Is there anywhere to get a latte around here without all the jingle bells and whistles? Blacktop Coffee, the new project of former Handsome Coffee Roasters founder Tyler Wells, has a no-fuss menu that's exceptional year-round. Plus, it's got a cozy spot in the tight-knit community of the Arts District, so you'll be able to feel the holiday spirit without having to drink it.

If you prefer your coffee black and icy (like, perhaps, the coal you were considering gifting this year), their cold brew is arguably the city's best. Their tap uses a nitrogen system to aerate each glass for a full, nuanced flavor. It's the quality and process you'd anticipate from the founder of Handsome, though Blacktop is less rigid — adding milk and sugar is allowed.

But if you're feeling festive, their chai is a must. The fiery blend of spices, maple syrup, and steamed milk is intrinsically Christmasy, like what you might expect from eggnog if eggnog was cool and foreign and didn't need alcohol to have a good time.

Looking to defrost a little more? Their mochas are made with tabs of solid chocolate, and are rich, drinkable, and not so sweet that you'd think Buddy the Elf got a day job as a barista.

So skip the line and the artificial Christmas tree at the local corporate coffee house and stop by Blacktop. Maybe skip the lumps of coal, too — your friends and family will thank you if they find a bag or two of artisanal coffee beans in their stocking instead.

FROM BKLYN TO DTLA

There's a crowd of people spilling onto the sidewalk in front of an old truck service station on Mateo Street. Most of them are carrying on lively conversations, while others mosey by jiving to the funky rhythms whirling through the air. A sweet woman greets you as you begin to survey the scene, offering a smile and a flyer that familiarizes you with what is seemingly a common swap meet. But what you discover is something more than your run of the mill outdoor market. As you make your way down the aisles, you'll observe vendors exchanging stories and passions, families sharing chef-inspired sandwiches and organic juices, girlfriends combing through artfully curated vintage clothes and handcrafted housewares. This place is a treasure trove of beautiful merchandise and equally beautiful people.

Artists & Fleas is a crossbreed of a flea and craft market. Their first market took place in Williamsburg, right before Brooklyn emerged as the epicenter of all things au courant. Now they're importing the same concept of community building 3,000 miles away to Los Angeles. Since May, Artist & Fleas has been setting up shop in the Arts District every third weekend of the month, rotating through a carefully curated list of approximately 50 vendors.

The artistic energy that's thriving in this enclave of Los Angeles is electrifying, and Artists & Fleas is curating a beautiful gathering place of people surrounding this creative commotion.

Don't be fooled by it's strip mall location. Blue Whale is serious about live music. Bring a date or just yourself, come here for the food, drinks, and smooth jazz any day of the week.

Be wary of the line out front but once inside energy quickly escalates. The good vibes and strong drinks turn this lounge into a dance club as night falls. Grab a slice of pizza from Two-Boots next door to soak up the lingering fun you just had.

SHOP HUNGRY

Urban Radish is an epicurean mecca of the Arts District. Within an 8,000 square foot warehouse on Mateo Street, the upscale grocery boasts a selection of gourmet foods, seasonal produce and imported wines — just the right ingredients to make a modern day Julia Childs out of anyone.

In July of 2013, Michael Aivazis and Carolyn Paxton introduced Urban Radish to the Arts District to create a community where local residents can walk to pick up a few high quality foods or grab ready to eat, organic meals. For a gormandized community, home to restaurants such as Bestia and Church & State, a grocery selling romanesco cauliflower and jamón ibérico could not be more timely.

Varieties of organic pasta, teas, jams, sauces, and oils stock the shelves in packaging that looks like The Dieline's Top Ten List. Meandering through the aisles provokes an inclination to host an intimate dinner for impressive feasting, because ingredients this gourmet, must be shared.

The produce section is set up like a European farmer's market: bundled, vibrant, and dripping in dew. These vegetables can easily turn a salad into a leafy work of art. Imported cheese and cured meats are encased within a vitrine conveniently

next to the wine selection. They're the necessary elements for the holy trinity of aperitifs: stinky cheese, aged meat, and velvety wine.

URBAN RADISH IS A PEACEFUL SHOPPING OASIS WHERE SHOPPERS COME IN TO DISCOVER NEW FOODS, FLAVORS, AND CRAVINGS.

Just steps away is the quaint, wi-fi equipped patio which sets the stage for gourmet snacking and live Brazilian jazz. Every Wednesday night and Saturday afternoon, customers work on their laptops, sip on wine, and listen to soothing jazz all while forgetting their initial purpose for milk and eggs.
